



## **LARRAKIA BACK IN MEMBERS' HANDS**

The Registrar of Indigenous Corporations, Anthony Beven, has today announced the end of the special administration at the Larrakia Nation Aboriginal Corporation (LNAC).

LNAC has been handed back to its members after six months under special administration.

The corporation is a large community-service organisation based in Darwin that runs night patrols and helps transport people to their homelands. It also carries out art programs, ranger services, aged care and after school and vacation care support.

On 9 September 2010 a majority of the directors wrote to the Registrar requesting the appointment of a special administrator. The Registrar appointed Mr Geoffrey Finch on 4 October 2010.

Before the end of the special administration, the special administrator appointed the following people as the directors of the corporation:

'I'm pleased to return control of the corporation back to its members and new directors,' Mr Beven said.
